EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES:

KEM Electric sparks change with grant funds



The Wishek Civic Center is a community staple.

One of the core values of KEM Electric Cooperative is commitment to its service area, whether through sponsorships, grants or participation in events. The Rural Development Finance Corporation (RDFC) grant helps demonstrate the true meaning of commitment.

KEM Electric received grant funding from RDFC to benefit its service area. The funds are allocated directly to KEM Electric, and entities apply for the grant funds. The applications are then reviewed by the RDFC committee before funding is awarded. KEM Electric was able to assist three entities in 2023 within its service area, including the Ashley Public School, city of Wishek and Wishek Park Board.

Ashley Public School

The Ashley Public School secured funding assistance to update the football scoreboard. At the home of the Mustangs, the scoreboard has been well utilized during the football season and will continue to be used in years to come.

City of Wishek

The city of Wishek acquired funds for the Wishek Civic Center ceiling project. The civic center holds many community events, such as public walking, weddings, 4-H events and various other activities, throughout the year. The new ceiling installation includes an upgrade in insulation that is more acoustic friendly, which will reduce echoing and noise during events.

"We are grateful for the funds, and they will be put to good use to give the civic center a facelift," says Mary Vickers, auditor for the city of Wishek.

Wishek Park Board

Lastly, the Wishek Park Board obtained funds for playground equipment updates at Green Lake Park, also known as Doyle Memorial Park. The equipment upgrade will add additional excitement to family camping and fishing trips at the park next year.

RDFC is a North Dakota nonprofit finance and development corporation whose member-owners are all the North Dakota electric cooperatives, nine North Dakota telecommunications cooperatives, the Broadband Association of North Dakota and the North Dakota Association of Rural Electric Cooperatives. RDFC was founded in 1994 with a desire to invest in rural communities. Almost 30 years later, its mission remains the same. RDFC's grant allotment included funds to member-cooperatives to support community-owned entities, nonprofits and community-based projects.

KEM Electric Cooperative will award eight \$500 scholarships to qualified applicants. KEM Electric will choose one graduating senior from Ashley, Wishek, Zeeland, Strasburg, Linton, Hazelton-Moffit-Braddock, Kidder County and Napoleon to receive scholarship funds.

Home school, GED setting or student outside of KEM service area

The co-op will also award one \$500 scholarship to a graduating senior from a homeschool setting, GED setting or a school outside of our service area.

\$1,000 Basin Electric Power Cooperative scholarship

KEM Electric Cooperative will award a \$1,000 scholarship to a student who is already enrolled or planning to enroll in a full-time graduate or undergraduate program. The student must attend an accredited two- or four-year program, university or vocational/tech school.

Luck-of-thedraw scholarship

KEM Electric will award two \$500 luck-of-the-draw scholarships.

These will be awarded in June at the KEM Electric annual meeting in Linton.

SAFETY STARTS WITH ME:

Holiday lighting tips

Amid the cheer that defines the holiday season, holiday lighting is one tradition bringing warmth and radiance to our homes. As we prepare to deck the halls and string those festive lights, it's vital to remember safety is the true star of the show.

"We know this is an exciting time for people to get ready for the holidays, but we want members to take a couple of things into account when decorating, including safety and light selection," says Dale Nagel, chief of staff/line superintendent at KEM Electric Cooperative.

Most holiday decorations involve some installation at heights, so it is important to keep the following in mind while decorating indoors and outside:

- Have a ground crew (one or two people) to steady your ladder and pass up the decoration, which is an invaluable part of safety and to keep you supplied with untangled light strings, fasteners and encouragement.
- 2. Remember to keep a safe distance from your overhead electric service.
- Don't overreach. If you cannot get to a point with your body completely centered between the sides of the ladder, get down and relocate the ladder.
- 4. Don't overextend the ladder. If your ladder is too short, rent or borrow a longer one. A ladder extended beyond its working limits is dangerous, as is standing on rungs too close to the top.
- 5. Do not overload circuits by stringing more light sets together than the manufacturer recommends. Check the packaging for details.
- 6. Check your wires for breaks and cracks in the insulation that can lead to shorts.

KEM Electric board meeting highlights **Sept 26, 2023**

The September meeting of the board of directors of KEM Electric Cooperative was held on Sept. 26 at BEK Communications in Steele. President Victor Wald called the meeting to order at 9:34 a.m. All directors were present. Also present were KEM Electric's Co-General Managers/CEOs Travis Kupper and Jason Bentz, Chief Financial Officer (CFO) Alex Craigmile, Legal Counsel Tom Bair, Operations Manager Dale Nagel, Member Relations Manager Marcy Sanders, and Executive Assistant and Board Liaison Connie Hill.

Consent agenda: There were a few additions made to the consent agenda. The agenda was approved as amended. The Aug. 22 meeting minutes were also approved.

Strategic/action: Bentz and Kupper presented the co-general managers' report, which included an update from the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association Region 5-6 meeting and a Basin Electric Power Cooperative update.

Action items: The 2024 capital budget was reviewed

and approved by the board. Financial items were also discussed and approved.

Department reports: Craigmile reviewed the financial report with details on the balance sheet and income statements. He is also working on the 2024 budget. Nagel provided a department report, outage reports, safety statistics for August and the September safety meeting minutes. Sanders presented a report, which included a department report, an annual meeting update, the Survey & Ballot contract and the October center pages. Chief Information Officer Charlie Dunbar provided a report the board reviewed.

Discussion and general information: Upcoming meetings and events were shared.

The board then entered into an executive session. The meeting concluded with the adjournment and Secretary-Treasurer Carter Vander Wal certified the accuracy of the minutes.

Next meeting date: The next meeting date was set for Oct. 24 at KEM Electric's office in Linton.
