



OFFICIAL NOTICE OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF MEMBERS

The annual meeting of the members of KEM Electric Cooperative Inc. will be held at the American Legion Barry-Hoof Post 72, Napoleon, at 7 p.m. CT on Thursday, June 15, to take action on the following matters:

1. Election of three directors

In connection with the election of three directors scheduled to be held at this meeting, the following members have been nominated for director by petition, which is in accordance with the bylaws of the cooperative:

District 4 Victor J Wald, Napoleon

District 5 Dean Dewald, Dawson

District-at-Large Carmen Essig, Lehr

2. For the transaction of such other and further business that may come before the meeting or any adjournment or adjournments thereof.
3. The board of directors of KEM Electric

3. The board of directors of KEM Electric Cooperative Inc. is proposing one amendment to cooperative bylaws.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO BYLAWS OF KEM ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE:

The board of directors of KEM Electric Cooperative Inc. is proposing an amendment to cooperative bylaws.

In 2022, the cooperative members approved an amendment to bylaw 306. That amendment allows electronic voting by cooperative members when so ordered by the board of directors. The proposed amendment to bylaw 404 changes the timing set out in the petition process. This will facilitate electronic voting.

Currently, nominating petitions are to be filed at the cooperative offices not less than 45 days prior to the date of the annual meeting. Petitions are not to be signed more than 90 days prior to the date petitions must be filed. The proposed amendment provides that petitions must be filed not less than 90 days prior to the meeting date and petitions are not to be signed more than 60 days prior to the date petitions must be filed.

Proposed bylaw amendment:

404 Member Petition - Form

- (a) Each petition shall contain the following:
- 1. The name of the member nominee.
- 2. The director position for which the member nominee shall run.
- 3. The printed names, addresses and telephone numbers, date of signature, and original signatures of each member signing the petition.
- 4. At least 10 signatures of the members of the respective district, or members at-large, as the case may be.
- (b) In the case of joint members, the signature of one or more than one joint member shall constitute one joint signature.
- (c) Firms, associations, corporations or body politics shall have the right to place one signature on a petition, the same as other members, by the signature of a duly appointed representative.
- (d) Petitions may not be circulated or signed more than 90 60 days before the date when petitions must be filed pursuant to this bylaw. Any signature to a nominating petition obtained more than 90 60 days before that date may not be counted.
- (e) All petitions must be filed at the principal offices of the cooperative not less than 45 90 days prior to the date of the meeting of the members, as fixed by the board of directors.
- (f) After verifying that a petition complies with this bylaw, the secretary of the board of directors shall post a list of nominations for directors at the principal office of the cooperative at least 30 60 days before the meeting of the members. This notice is given pursuant to bylaw 1401 of the bylaws of KEM Electric Cooperative Inc.

Safety Starts with ME: **Down and dangerous**

If you see a downed power line, always assume it is energized and dangerous. Avoid going near it or anything in contact with the power line.

If you are in an accident with a utility pole, your vehicle may be charged with electricity. If this is the case and you step out of the car, you will become the electricity's path to the ground and could be electrocuted. Loose wires and other equipment may be in contact with your car or near it, creating a risk for electrocution if you leave the vehicle.

"While downed lines can sometimes reveal they are live by arcing and sparking with electricity, this is not always the case. Power lines do not always show signs that they are live, but they are just as lethal," said Kevin Horner, a foreman at KEM Electric Cooperative.

After an accident, stay in the car and tell others to do the same. If you come upon an accident or see downed power lines, do not approach the accident scene. If you see someone approaching, warn them to stay away, as a downed power line energizes the ground up to 35 feet away. Call 911 to notify emergency personnel and utility services. Do not leave your vehicle until a utility professional has told you it is safe to do so.

If you're in an accident, the safest place to be is almost always inside the car. The only circumstance when you should exit the vehicle is if it is on fire, and those instances are rare. If you must exit the vehicle, jump clear of it with your feet together and without touching the



vehicle and ground at the same time. Continue to "bunny hop" with your feet together to safety. Doing this will ensure you are at only one point of contact and will not have different strengths of electric current running from one foot to another, which can be deadly.

If Horner could give members one piece of advice it would be, "Always stay away from downed power lines, as they can be very dangerous."

Q&A on electric vehicles

You've likely heard or read that most automakers are transitioning many or all of their new vehicles to electric-only models over the next 10 years. Regardless of the type of car you drive today, the electrification of the transportation sector is underway.

As we receive inquiries about electric vehicles from KEM Electric Cooperative members, we thought it would be helpful to respond to some of those frequently asked questions in this month's issue of *North Dakota Living*.

Q: Why is KEM communicating about electric vehicles?

A: It's no secret that consumer interest in electric vehicles (EVs) is growing, and KEM Electric is providing information about EVs so our members can make informed decisions when considering an EV purchase.

Q: Can I charge my EV using an existing outlet or do I need a special outlet?

A: All EVs come with a 110-volt-compatible (Level 1) charging unit, which can be plugged into any standard household outlet. For an eight-hour overnight charge, this will enable traveling 36 to 40 miles a day. If you typically drive longer distances or are in a hurry, a Level 2 charger takes about half the time and provides about 180 miles of range over an eight-hour charging period. A Level 2 charger must be installed by a licensed electrician.

Q: Does the outside temperature affect the range of an EV?

A: Outside temperatures, particularly colder weather, can impact the range of an EV. Unlike a gas-powered vehicle, where the heat is mostly coming from the engine, an EV must produce cabin heat and manage an optimal battery temperature with energy that comes from the battery, which can reduce battery range.

Q: Should I let my co-op know if I plan to purchase an EV?

A: If you plan to purchase an EV, please let us know so we can better serve you. As more members look to purchase an EV, KEM Electric must ensure we have the necessary electric infrastructure in place to meet future EV charging needs, without jeopardizing the ability to keep reliable power flowing to our local homes and businesses.


As your local energy provider, KEM Electric is best suited to advise and help our members and local businesses plan for the electric vehicle future.
